EACH MODULE CONTAINTS:

- **Document 2:** List of the 30 terms to learn with activities
- Audio: with the pronunciation of the 30 terms you have to study, which have been taken from the theory
- Document 3: Further materials for those who want to go further in the knowledge of the topic provided with links to texts and videos
- Assessment tests you have to take to be evaluated

AND THIS IS THE WAY TO PROCEED:

- 1. Watch the VIDEO
- 2. Study the theory in **DOCUMENT 1**
- 3. Study the 30 terms and do the activities **DOCUMENT 2**
- 4. Listen to the AUDIO
- 5. OPTIONAL: Go to further materials DOCUMENT 3
