## B. Listen to the audio of each term. Repeat each term after you hear the sound. Do it several times.

## C. Pay special attention to the pronunciation of the following terms, check document 'materials to get you started'

- 1. Architecture /ˈɑːkɪ,tɛktʃə/: this word has two stresses, one in the first syllable which is strong, and a weak one in the third syllable. Make sure to pronounce the last syllable /tʃə/ properly
- Detached house /dɪ'tætʃt/: have a look at the three different ways of pronouncing the –ed ending in 'materials to get you started' document. In this case it sounds 't'
- 3. Engineering / ɛndʒɪ'nɪərɪŋ/: note that this word has two stresses, the strongest one is in the 3rd syllable, and sounds /'nɪə/ not /'nə/, a typical mistake. Engineering is the profession and 'engineer' / ɛndʒɪ'nɪə/ is the person who has a degree in engineering. Make sure you do not say "I have a degree in civil <u>engineer</u>", but "I have a degree in civil <u>engineering</u>"
- 4. **Environment** /In 'varrənmənt/: it is a difficult word, pronounce it several times; pronounce the 'v' properly and do not forget the 't' sound at the end
- 5. **Erection** /ɪˈrɛk**ʃən**/: Spanish speaking people do not pronounce the words ending in '-tion' properly, make sure you do /ʃən/
- 6. Land clearance / kliprons/: repeat 'clearance' several times
- LEED certification / ss:trf1'ke1fən/: the syllables ce/ci sound 's' in English. Note also the /fən/ at the end
- 8. Mason / meisen/: the /ə/ hardly sounds
- 9. **Project stages** /steɪdʒis/: observe the 's' at the beginning position. Do not forget to pronounce the plural in 'stages'
- 10. **Scaffolding** /'skæfəldɪŋ/: the 's' at the initial position sounds 's' without an 'e', a typical mistake, as there is not this sound in Spanish
- 11. **Sewerage system** /'su:ərɪdʒ/: note the sound of 'sewerage', it is a difficult sound, repeat it several times
- 12. **Shell** /ʃɛl/ 'sh' is pronounced /ʃ /, a sound which is not found in Spanish. Words that are spelt 'sh' are pronounced /ʃ /, but sometimes 's' is also pronounced /ʃ / **NOT** /s/ like in 'sugar' /'ʃʊɡə/ or in 'sure' /ʃʊə/.

- 13. Site /saɪt/: notice it is /ai/, not /i/.
- 14. **Urban planning** /'s:b<sup>o</sup>n/: the 'u' at initial position may be pronounced as a vowel like in 'urban' or as a consotant like in university / ju:ni'vs:sɪtɪ/, or 'utility' /ju: 'tɪlɪtɪ/. This last word means a public service providing electricity or water.
- 15. **Wiring** / waiəriŋ/: note the pronunciation of the first 'i' it has three vowels. Repeat it several times.
