B. Listen to the audio of each term. Repeat each term after you hear the sound. Do it several times.

C. Pay special attention to the pronunciation of the following terms, check document 'materials to get you started':

- 1. **Casement** /'keɪsmənt/: note that you must pronounce the 't' at the end of the word.
- 2. **Façade** /fəˈsɑːd/: it is a loan word from French. Be aware that the stress is in the second syllable and that the 'ç' is pronounced /s/ **NOT** /k/.
- 3. **Fixed window** /frkst/: there are three consonants at the end of the word, so, make sure you pronounce the three of them. Check regular verbs pronunciation.
- 4. **Frame** /'freIm/: close your mouth to pronounce the 'm' properly at the end of the word.
- 5. **Glazing** / gleizin/: pronounce the first syllable as you see it in the phonetics.
- 6. Hardware / ha:d wee/: 'h' is pronounced softly.
- Jamb /dʒæm/: letter 'b' is not pronounced. Note there is an 'm' at the end of the word. 'Jamb' is a homophone, it is pronounced the same as 'jam' /dʒæm/; however, its meanings are (1) crushed fruit with sugar, or (2) squeeze into a confined space.
- 8. Keyhole / ki: heul/: note that the sound of 'key' is not /kei/ but a long /i:/.
- 9. Loadbearing /'laud bearing/: check to pronounce 'bearing' properly.
- 10. **Operable** /'ppərəb_el/: the stress is in the first syllable. Observe that the 'e' at the end of the word is hardly pronounced.
- 11. **Partition** /pɑːˈtɪʃən/: the stress is in the second syllable. Also, pay attention to the /ʃ/ sound, and, as you know now, words ending in 'tion' are pronounced /ʃən/.
- 12. Sash /sæʃ/: as you know 'sh' is pronounced /ʃ /.
- 13. **Tilt and turn window** /tɪlt ænd tɜːn/: when a word ends in a consonant and the following one starts with a vowel, they sound together.
